Regulating used vehicles in the

- Vehicle emissions are among the high contributors to poor air quality;
- Air quality has immense repercussions on human health, environment, economy and climate change among others;
- Policies, regulations and standards developed in the Partner States and EAC to mitigate negative impacts.
- Intervention on standards focused on clean fuels and vehicle emissions

Harmonization of Fuel and Vehicle Emission Standards

- Priority for quality, safety and protection of the environment;
- First harmonized in 2000;
- * Revised in 2005 to cater for unleaded fuel;
- In the 2000 version of the two main standards EAC 158: Automotive Gasoline (Premium Motor Spirit) and EAS 177: Automotive Gas Oil (Automotive diesel), Sulphur content was at 500ppm;
- During the revision of 2012, level reduced to 150ppm with Partner States committing to reduce it to 50ppm

Standards Development and Revision Milestones

- First harmonized in 2000;
- * Revised in 2005 to cater for unleaded fuel;
- ❖ EAS 500 2008; Code of practice Testing of motor vehicles for roadworthiness
- In the 2000 version of the two main standards EAC 158: Automotive Gasoline (Premium Motor Spirit) and EAS 177: Automotive Gas Oil (Automotive diesel), Sulphur content was at 500ppm;
- During the revision of 2012, level reduced to 150ppm with Partner States committing to reduce it to 50ppm by 2014;

Harmonization of Fuel Standards Cont'

- 2019 revision, Sulphur levels set at 50 ppm max (Analytical data however shows that most levels are at 10 ppm or less);
- Further in 2019 started harmonization of EAC standard for vehicle emissions;
- Agreed to adopt EAC vehicle exhaust emission standards at Euro 4 / IV;
- Kenya and Rwanda already have national standards for vehicle exhaust emission at Euro IV,
- Standard already under implementation in Rwanda

Priority areas for harmonization

- Finalise harmonization of the EAC standard for vehicle emissions
- Revision of EAS 159 Specification for engine oils;
 - Specification for base oil; Heavy fuel oils— Specification; LPG;
 - Classification of hydraulic fluids;
 - Engine coolant—Specification;
 - Brake fluids—Specification;
- Gear oils—Specification;
- Greases—Specification;
- ATF

Recommendations and the way forward

- Adopt Euro IV for Vehicle exhaust emissions;
- Lobby and promote EAC position on the harmonization initiatives under;
 - Tripartite Transport Transport and Transit Facilitation Programme (TTTFP);
 - African Standardization Organization (ARSO)
- Capacity building on Conformity Assessment (Testing, inspection and certification) to facilitate standards implementation
